A World Changing Christmas Gift of Water!

Giving the Gift of Clean Water

One-half of our Christmas offering has been designated to fund the gift of clean, safe water for the children of Ramula Odowa Secondary School in Nyakach, Kenya

Thank you for partnering with us to provide this wonderful Christmas gift!



Since 2011 Ingomar Living Waters, a ministry of Ingomar Church, has been bringing the gift of clean water to the world. There are 785 million people throughout the world who lack access to clean water, and Ingomar Living Waters continues to work diligently to change that.

At Christmas time 2020, Ingomar Church designated one-half of the Christmas offering to bring life-giving water to Subuku Village in Kenya. The only water source for this village was a contaminated, rain-fed pond, that is miles away. Ingomar Church rose to the occasion by giving the gift of clean water to this village.

In 2021, Ingomar Church again designated one-half of the Christmas offering to provide the gift of clean water — this time to the children of the Ramula Odowa Secondary School in Nyakach, Kenya. These children drink water from a river filled with water-borne diseases. Funding from our Christmas


Isaiah 55:6

Bruce Shelley's classic history of the church brings the story of global Christianity into the twenty-first century. Like a skilled screenwriter, Shelley begins each chapter with three elements: characters,

setting, plot. Taking readers from the early centuries of the church up through the modern era he tells his readers a story of actual people, in a particular situation, taking action or being acted upon, provides a window into the circumstances and historical context, and from there develops the story of a major period or theme of Christian history.

Highlighting our Chancel Windows

The sanctuary of Ingomar Church has many symbols to help us reflect on the life of Jesus. As we highlight our 14 chancel windows, this issue features the Chalice window.

The chalice was a special drinking cup used by Jesus for communion with the disciples. When used alone, the chalice stands for faith; when used with a wafer, it symbolizes his communion.



"Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks, he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Ingomar Church Mission Outreach: 2021 In Review

The Mission Outreach Committee of Ingomar Church strives to spread God's love by promoting and supporting opportunities for mission through education, service and financial support.

During 2021, in spite of the pandemic, mission outreach efforts remained active and had positive impact on many lives.

2021 Online Service Auction

The year began with an online fundraising event (the "UN-Rummage Sale") through which 65 service items were auctioned off. The event raised \$11,200 which was donated to five local organizations:

- **Bethany House Academy** – supporting education / poverty reduction in the community of Northview Heights
- **Daily Bread Soup Kitchen** – providing meals to homeless and underemployed
- **Hair Peace Charities** – providing encouragement and financial support for women/girls undergoing chemotherapy
- **HEARTH** – providing supportive services including housing to family survivors of domestic violence
- **North Hills Community Outreach** – providing supportive services to people in crisis, hardship and poverty

Homeless Care Kit Ministry

The Mission Committee began a new project, intended to be ongoing, making kits for people experiencing homelessness. Donations of toiletries, socks, snacks, etc. were collected and 60 bags were assembled. The kits were made available at the Information Center areas for people to take, keep in their cars, and distribute whenever they encountered individuals on the street asking for money. The initial batch of kits has been taken and donations are being received to create more.

AmazonSmile

When you shop at AmazonSmile, Amazon donates 0.5% of the price of your eligible AmazonSmile purchases to Ingomar Church Mission Outreach. Thanks to all who selected Ingomar United Methodist Church as their charitable organization, and then did their Amazon shopping at smile.amazon.com. Amazon Smile brought in \$406 for the first 3 quarters of the year, which supports the organizations on our list.

Thanksgiving on Every Table 2021

Through its annual 'Thanksgiving on Every Table' initiative, North Hills Community Outreach (NHCO) provides a Thanksgiving meal for local families in need. This year donations from Ingomar Church reached a total of \$5380 in gift cards.

Angel Trees 2021

Through our Angel Tree program, we provide support to the North Hills Community Outreach (NHCO) Toy Drive, and support for the Northview Heights Coat Drive at Bethany House. This year we provided 60 gifts and over \$200 in gift cards for the Toy Drive and 46 coats and lots of mittens, hats and scarves for the Coat Drive.

Year-Round Volunteer Opportunities

Ingomar Church Mission Outreach has volunteers going to Daily Bread Soup Kitchen on a monthly basis and to Global Links. Many other volunteer opportunities that are typically supported are not in operation due to pandemic.

Year-Round Financial Support

The committee provides financial support to several overseas missionaries, the Western Pennsylvania UMC Camping and Retreat Ministries, Global Links, Eastbrook Mission Barn, Honduras Hope Mission and a few others as well as the five local organizations mentioned previously in the 2021 Online Service Auction info. Supplies are donated and taken to North Hills Community Outreach food bank on a regular basis.

Looking Ahead to 2022

Our second annual **Online Service Auction** will be held on **Friday, February 25 through Sunday, February 27**. Funds raised will go to local organizations focusing on families and those struggling with poverty. We hope that many more people will get involved this year so we can top last year's number.

- There are several ways to get involved. Think about what kind of service you can offer. It can be anything from making a specialty food item, offering a service such as tax advice, perennial garden planning, tutoring, spring cleaning of a yard, hauling junk to the dump, babysitting, dog walking, anything that is your talent or interest.
- Encourage your small group and others to get involved. Everyone has a special talent that they can offer.
- Sign up to bid online and bid on your favorite items. The website is very user friendly. Monetary donations can also be made through the website. The link will be shared closer to the auction date.

The pandemic has forced us to explore new ways of doing things, but the purpose of bringing help and sharing our love with others remains the same. Mark your calendars for the auction and start thinking about how you can be involved.

In closing, the Missions Committee wishes to thank all church family and friends for their generous donations throughout the year, which made it possible for the committee to provide funding of about \$100,000 to organizations we support.

Ingomar Living Waters (ILW): 2021 in Review

2021 - A Record Year! With the world still in the grips of the pandemic, Ingomar Living Waters created an online virtual event in 2021. The *Virtual Turning Wine Into Water* event was well attended and raised a record \$170,000+! Thank you to all of the generous long-supporting donors for your continued dedication to this mission. ILW also saw a record increase of first-time donors - and we are most grateful to each one.

Projects funded in 2021 spanned 17 different countries: Rwanda, Pakistan, Uganda, South Sudan, Ethiopia, Ghana, Dominican Republic, Honduras, Peru, Burkina Faso, Nicaragua, India, Malawi, Liberia, Zambia, Kenya, and a new country in 2021 - Democratic Republic of the Congo.

2021 was a record-breaking year for funds raised, as well as projects funded and completed. We were able to fund and implement:

- 45 wells (48% increase since 2020)
- 3 water filtration systems
- 4 water sanitation projects (so much in need since the rise of COVID infections)
- 3 water distribution systems
- 6 clean water projects (i.e. filters, WASH programs, store and containment systems)

In 2021, ILW also obtained a new partner, **LifeWater**. A focus of their mission is to stay in a village for an average of five years to help educate and implement water projects. We partnered with them on a clean water project in Dodola Region in Ethiopia. In Dodola, water usage is exceptionally low, with the average household using only 13

gallons of water per day between five-six people. The World Health Organization recommends a minimum of 13 gallons per day per person to meet basic hydration, hygiene and sanitation needs. These families have been surviving on what amounts to sips of water a day. We were able to help provide clean, sustainable water to these villagers.

Since 2011, Ingomar Living Waters has funded:

- 168 Wells
- 28 Water Filtration Projects
- 28 Sanitations Projects
- 31 Water Distribution Projects
- 32 Other types of water-related projects
- 3,500 Water Filters

Impacting over 522,000 people in 27 countries worldwide.
