Please join us each Sunday in Advent for our message series "Born to Deliver." As we prepare ourselves through scripture and song, our series will consider Isaiah's prophecy of comfort for God's people (Isaiah 40:1-5), the assurance of Psalm 24 that the King of Glory comes to "those who seek the face of God," Isaiah's prophecy of the joy of redemption (Isaiah 35), and the promise to those who walk in the ways of the Lord (Isaiah 2:2-5).

On Christmas Eve, we celebrate the birth of "Jesus, the Light of the World" (Luke 2:1-20) and on December 31, we respond by proclaiming the Good News (Luke 2:8). Please join us throughout this Advent journey and as we celebrate this wondrous Christmas season!

Ingomar Living Waters Christmas Offering Project

Ingomar Living Waters (ILW) is a ministry of Ingomar Church. Since its founding in 2011 when Ingomar Church decided to devote its Christmas Eve offering to bringing the gift of clean water by funding a water project, ILW has grown to bring the gift of clean water to over 700,000 people across 32 countries.

Half of this year's Christmas Eve offering at Ingomar Church will go towards a clean water project in Mepe, Ghana.

In 2023, the worst flooding in decades devastated large swaths of central Africa ranging from Somalia and Kenya in the east to Niger and Ghana in the west.

One of the hardest hit areas is along the Volta River delta in southeast Ghana, affecting towns downstream including the town of Mepe. In Mepe, about 200 homes were washed away and thousands of homes were flooded.

Approximately 95% of the people in Mepe get their water from the Volta River. Since the flooding, the

Volta River has been so contaminated by receding floodwaters that it is very dangerous to drink. While Mepe needed a public clean water source prior to the flooding, **access to clean water has now become critical.**

For this year's Christmas Offering project, ILW has partnered with a Pittsburgh-based charity called **Hope for Ghana** to help those in Mepe.

They are working to put a borehole well with an electric pump and storage tanks next to the junior high school in Mepe. This will not only provide public access to clean water for the first time ever in Mepe, it will provide easily accessible water to the 550 students at the school in addition to another 3,000 in the local area.

This project will cost \$15,000. Please be generous in helping us bring the Christmas gift of clean water to the people of Mepe, Ghana.

Thank you, Earl Marsh, for 20 years of Service at Global Links

For 20 years, Earl Marsh has been a monthly volunteer with Global Links, and has served as liaison between Global Links and our volunteers for the past 16 years.



Global Links is a Pittsburgh-based non-profit dedicated to improving health in communities with need. They share surplus rescued from the US healthcare system to support health programs globally and locally. Our volunteers help to repack these supplies for shipping.

This month, at the age of 96½, Earl is stepping down as liaison. Through his service, Earl has helped countless people get the supplies they need and

cannot otherwise afford. Thank you, Earl, for faithfully representing Ingomar Church in this mission!

While Earl intends to continue participating as he is able, this creates an opportunity for someone who is passionate about health in communities in need, who is willing to serve as liaison to coordinate our volunteers. There is also always a need for more volunteers on the third Thursday of each month.
